## Compton Dundon School

The governing bodies of both Compton Dundon and Kingsdon Primary Schools, at their respective July 2009 meetings, voted unanimously in favour of formally exploring Federation between the two schools.

(Federation is a governance structure whereby one or more school share a single governing body under section 24 of the Education Act 2002. Within a federation, all schools retain their separate identity and continue to receive individual budget shares. A shared governing body provides an effective and accountable mechanism for schools to pool resources and staff, release

strategic capacity in the senior management team, and gain economies of scale and efficiencies. Sharing specialist staff and pooling curriculum expertise and materials can enable schools to deliver an enriched education.)

In September, there will be a six-week consultation period with all stakeholders, during which a proforma outlining the proposal will be made available to give everyone a chance to make their views known. The intention is to collaborate from 1st September 2009 with a view of Federating on 1st January 2010.
